

Author Interview Questions; Sample Questions pulled from several interviews

Can you tell us a little about yourself and how long you've been writing?

I am a consultant and have been consulting with large and small organizations for over 20 years. I have consulted with many Fortune 500 organizations, as well as much smaller for-profit and non-profit organizations. My areas of specialization include instructional design, technical writing, and career coaching. As a career coach I have worked with over 5,000 clients in their career transition process.

As far as writing, I have been writing for as long as I can remember. I love the written word and think there is power in print. When a friend showed me a thank-you note she had saved from 10 years earlier, I knew there was a special kind of force in words.

Can you tell us why you wrote your book?

Your Road to Damascus is a response to the need for a faith-based resource that relates the biblical perspective of how God works through a job loss. In dealing with career coaching clients I have assisted numerous individuals whose faith was an important part of their lives. Yet, there was no resource available that provided insight on how God may use this kind of situation in their lives, and presented principles from scripture on how to make the most of this situation.

I realized while working with a pastor who had left the ministry and was searching for a new position that our program was the same for him as it was for anyone else, believer or not. And that just didn't seem right.

To check and see what was available I looked at Google and Amazon to see what we could use when working with Christian clients. And I found nothing, zilch, nada, zero. There were a few that dealt with career decisions from a higher level, but nothing at the level I required.

Then as I reflected on my own experiences with losing a job, I realized that I had been taught the actions I needed to take to put a resume together, prepare for interviewing, and all the rest, but never how God may be using that situation.

Thus the need was identified, and the adventure began.

Can you tell us briefly what your book is about?

Your Road to Damascus is about finding hope and encouragement in the midst of a life crisis, in this case the loss of a job. While the specifics of the book focus on how God works in a job loss and job search, in the bigger picture it is about how God works in any crisis we face.

While we seek to be heavenly minded, we have to admit that we are firmly rooted in the soil of everyday life on this planet. With that comes the struggles and challenges we all face; death of a loved one, terminal illness, broken relationships, financial hardship and so many more. The good news is that God doesn't desert us in those times, but walks that road with us.

As we walk the road to Damascus in our vocational lives, God is there to bless and have a personal encounter with us when we are doing well on the job and when we are terminated. That is what this book is about.

Who is your intended audience? Have you been able to crossover into other audiences as well?

The primary audience is the Christian community. They will appreciate the biblical orientation more than the average Joe. However, I have had reviewers tell me that they hope the book will be available outside the church as well because of the message of hope and encouragement.

In targeting the Christian community I want to get information to:

- Pastors.
- The unemployed.
- College and seminary seniors about to graduate.
- Financial planners working with people at making sense of their finances.
- Career coaches and counselors.
- Military personnel and chaplains.
- Prisoners in jail and chaplains.
- Entrepreneurs.
- CEOs and HR Directors of Christian organizations.

What kind of research did you have to do during the writing process?

There are two aspects to *Your Road to Damascus*; the biblical and theological aspect, and the practical and action aspect.

The practical and action aspect is something I have been using for 20 years in guiding clients in a job search. These have been proven beneficial and effective practices to use to give a job search feet and move it on down the road to a new position. Examining these in the light of scripture however was another story.

Since this book is an integration of biblical and practical guidelines, I had to make sure what principles the Bible spoke of for those making a job change. This is where the challenge came in. Nowhere is there a passage that refers to how individuals made a job change. Oh, there are plenty of principles there, but they are woven into the lives of people. This was where my research came in. What people could I find in the Bible that make 'job changes,' and what could I learn about how God brought those about.

There are plenty of people in the Bible that made huge job changes; David went from being a shepherd to being a king. Moses, Abraham, Noah and others in the Old Testament went from being one thing to being another as God directed the adventure of their lives. In the New Testament, the 12 apostles were not theologians, priests, or rabbis. They were regular people; you don't get any more regular than being a fisherman. But God directed them to change jobs, change careers, and they started new lives with a new purpose.

For purposes of this book, I chose to follow the lives of two people and how God moved them from one job to another. Joseph, of coat-of-many-colors fame in the Old Testament, went from being a spoiled son who worked in the fields helping to shepherd sheep to being the Prime Minister of Egypt. And Saul of Tarsus went from being a persecutor of Christians to a leader in the Christian movement and writer of many of the New Testament books.

My research focused on how God accomplished this in the lives of these two men.

What is your favorite quote, by whom, and why?

I have several favorite quotes, but will only include a couple here.

"The church can't resurrect what the home puts to death," by Chuck Swindoll is one of my favorites because it stresses the need for the church and the home to work together.

“God whispers in our pleasure, but shouts in our pain,” by C.S. Lewis is another. This one talks about how God is always communicating, even when we don’t want to hear from Him. He whispers in our pleasures because we are so caught up in ourselves that we have to force ourselves to stop and listen, and shouts in our pain because we are so overwhelmed by the emotional trauma that we can’t even hear when He shouts. Notice, both of these are self-centered and that is too much the way we are.

What inspires you to write and why?

The bottom line of this book, which really expresses my desire, is to solve problems. I realized some time ago that almost all that I did was to speak to a problem, or provide resources to help solve a problem. *Your Road to Damascus* does both of those; it helps people understand how their faith intersects with their job hunt, and it provides practical resources to enable readers to look for a job more effectively.

It’s not a sit-down-and-read- it-through kind of book. It’s really two books in one; a theological presentation on how the Bible views a job search, and a technical workbook on the various aspects of a job search.

Thank you so much for this interview, Bill. Do you have any final words?

I appreciate the opportunity to share some of my life, experience, and thoughts with your readers.

While *Your Road to Damascus: 6 Biblical Secrets for an Effective Job Search* is primarily about how to find meaning and renewal in a job search, it is about far more than that. It is really about how to find meaning in life. It is about what you do in a time of crisis. It is about Who you rely on when your own resources have dried up.

Even if you aren’t looking for a job right now, you can pass along news of this book to friends and family that are, and you can also find that it will bring meaning to other areas in your life where you may be struggling.

As you travel down your own road to Damascus, may God open roadside vistas that reveal Him for all that He is and open your eyes to the adventure He wants to have with you.


William Y. Higgins in his new book, “Your Road to Damascus” published by Mindware Publishing gives us 6 Biblical Secrets for an Effective Job Search.







“Your Road to Damascus” is not about a how to find a job outline but a book on the journey a person takes on the road to finding purpose as it relates to career.

A Celebration of Work as a Gift from God

Rationale: Work is what keeps our country, communities, and church going. God endorses and ordains work and commissions workers in His kingdom. An individual's meaning in life in part comes from an understanding of where they fit in God's kingdom and family, and that's about work.

- **Date:**
A date in the Spring since this is a time of new beginnings. The month of May is suggested as an appropriate time for this focus.

- **Church bulletin and verbal announcements:** (See previous page for other suggestions.)
Focus announcements for the week on church events and programs dealing with unemployment, employee support, employee resources, et al. (See suggestions on preceding pages.)

- **Sermon:**
A few suggested topics for a celebrate work message include:
 - God's view of work.
 - God's view of a job loss / job search (See *Your Road to Damascus* for content.)
 - God's view of retirement and volunteers.
 - God's invitation to join His adventure.
 - Joseph's life and vocational path as seen in Genesis 39ff and in *Your Road to Damascus*.

- **Devotional:**
Produce a devotional to be distributed to church attendees to use during this month focusing on passages of scripture dealing with work. (See following list for ideas.)

- **Prayer:**
Focus prayer during the service on individual, corporate, and national employment needs:
 - As individuals face challenges on the job.
 - As individuals are searching for work.
 - As individuals use their time and talents in retirement.
 - As volunteers in hospitals, the church, schools, and with other faith-based organizations.
 - Organize a month of dedicated prayer with sin-ups to pray for specific needs at a specific time, trying to cover the entire month.
 - For your church ministry needs and the opportunities you have.
 - For the country and needs of the unemployed and their loved ones.

- **Music:**

- **Scripture:**

Here are few passages that have an aspect of commitment to work focus:

- **Deuteronomy 15:10:** Give generously to them and do so without a grudging heart; then because of this the LORD your God will bless you in all your work and in everything you put your hand to. (NIV)
- **Deuteronomy 24:14:** Do not take advantage of a hired worker who is poor and needy, whether that worker is a fellow Israelite or a foreigner residing in one of your towns. (NIV)
- **Exodus:18:18:** The work is too heavy for you; you cannot handle it alone.
- **II Chronicles 15:7:** But as for you, be strong and do not give up, for your work will be rewarded.
- **Nehemiah 4:6:** For the people worked with all their heart.
- **Nehemiah 6:16:** When all our enemies heard about this, all the surrounding nations were afraid and lost their self-confidence, because they realized that this work had been done with the help of our God.
- **Psalms 90:17:** May the favor of the Lord our God rest on us; establish the work of our hands for us-yes, establish the work of our hands. (NIV)
- **Psalms 128:2:** You will eat the fruit of your labor; blessings and prosperity will be yours. (NIV)
- **Proverbs 12:11:** Those who work their land will have abundant food, but those who chase fantasies have no sense. (NIV)
- **Proverbs 14:23:** All hard work brings a profit, but mere talk leads only to poverty. (NIV)
- **Proverbs 16:3, 11:** Commit your work to the LORD, and then your plans will succeed... The LORD demands fairness in every business deal; he sets the standard.
- **Proverbs 18:9:** One who is slack in his work is brother to one who destroys. (NIV)
- **Ecclesiastes 3:13, 22:** And also that every man should eat and drink, and enjoy the good of all his labor, it is the gift of God...So I saw that there is nothing better for a person than to enjoy their work, because that is their lot. For who can bring them to see what will happen after them? (NIV)
- **Ecclesiastes 4:9:** Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor: (NIV) **Isaiah 64:8:** Yet you, LORD, are our Father. We are the clay, you are the potter; we are all the work of your hand. (NIV)
- **Luke 10:40 :** But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to him and asked, "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!" (NIV)
- **John 5:17:** In his defense Jesus said to them, "My Father is always at his work to this very day, and I too am working." (NIV)
- **John 6:27:** Do not work for food that spoils, but for food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him God the Father has placed his seal of approval. (NIV)
- **John 17:4:** I have brought you glory on earth by completing the work you gave me to do.
- **Acts 20:35:** In everything I did, I showed you that by this kind of hard work we must help the weak, remembering the words the Lord Jesus himself said: 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.' (NIV)
- **I Corinthians 3:8, 9:** The man who plants and the man who waters have one purpose, and each will be rewarded according to his own labor. For we are God's fellow workers; you are God's field, God's building.
- **1 Corinthians 4:12:** We work hard with our own hands. When we are cursed, we bless; when we are persecuted, we endure it; (NIV)

- **1 Corinthians 15:58**; Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain. (NIV)
- **Ephesians 4:28**: He must labor, performing with his own hands what is good, so that he will have something to share with one who has need.
- **Ephesians 6:6**: Work hard, but not just to please your masters when they are watching. As slaves of Christ, do the will of God with all your heart. Work with enthusiasm, as though you were working for the Lord rather than for people.
- **Colossians 3:23**: Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, (NIV)
- **1 Thessalonians 4:11**; ...and to make it your ambition to lead a quiet life: You should mind your own business and work with your hands, just as we told you, (NIV)
- **2 Thessalonians 3:10**: For even when we were with you, we gave you this rule: "The one who is unwilling to work shall not eat." (NIV)
- **Hebrews 6:10**: God is not unjust; he will not forget your work and the love you have shown him as you have helped his people and continue to help them. (NIV)
- **1 Timothy 4:10**: That is why we labor and strive, because we have put our hope in the living God, who is the Savior of all people, and especially of those who believe. (NIV)
